This list consists of 821 species, subspecies, and varieties' (taxa) of vascular native plants that are classified as rare (S1, S2, SH, SX), or uncommon (S3) in the state of Delaware. Rare taxa (657) are of conservation concern in the state and represents 40% of the overall native flora of Delaware (1640 taxa). The rare and uncommon taxa collectively, represents 50% of the native flora. Of the 657 rare taxa, 191 are historical and 47 are thought to be extirpated, which collectively represent 14% of the native flora. There are 53 taxa in Delaware that are globally rare or uncommon (G1, G2, G3, T1, T2, T3). Seven (7) taxa that are Federally listed by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (Endangered, LE; Threatened LT). One-hundred-fifteen (115) taxa that are rare or uncommon in the North Atlantic region of the eastern U.S. Eleven (11) taxa that are endemic or disjunct in Delaware. Seventy-five (75) taxa that reach their northern limit of natural distribution in Delaware, and 23 taxa reach their southern limit. Status criteria is described below.

## Status Criteria

Status ranks are based on a system used by Nature Serve, a non-profit conservation organization that is a leading source for information about rare and endangered species and threatened ecosystems. Status ranks are a measure of the relative rarity of a species, and **State Status** ranks reflect the rarity of a species in Delaware. The **Global Status** rank reflects the rarity of a species worldwide. The **North Atlantic Region Status** reflects the rarity of a species within the North Atlantic Region [New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Quebec, and Prince Edward Island), 12 U.S. states (Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Virginia), and the District of Columbia]. The **Federal Status** rank refers to species listed as either Endangered (LE) or Threatened (LT) by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Status ranks are used to prioritize conservation and protection efforts so the rarest of species receives immediate attention. The primary criterion for ranking a species is based on the total number of documented occurrences or populations, with strong consideration given to the quality of the occurrence (i.e., size and vigor of a population and condition of habitat), as well as threats to an occurrence and its habitat. Status ranks for individual species are frequently updated and are based on current knowledge.

### State Status

S1: Extremely rare and of conservation concern; typically, 5 or fewer extant occurrences or populations in the state; or only a few remaining individuals; may be especially vulnerable to extirpation.

S1.1: To date, only a single extant occurrence or population of this species is known to exist in the state.

S2: Very rare and of conservation concern; typically, between 6 and 20 known occurrences or populations; may be susceptible to becoming extirpated.

S3: Uncommon not of conservation concern; typically, 21 to 50 known occurrences or populations; S3 ranked species are not yet susceptible to becoming extirpated in the state but may be if additional populations are destroyed.

S4: Common; apparently secure under present conditions; typically, 51 or more known occurrences or populations, but may be fewer with many large populations; usually not susceptible to immediate threats.

S5: Very common; demonstrably secure under present conditions.

SU: Status Uncertain; species that are thought to be rare or uncommon in the state, but cannot presently be included within another classification, due to: questionable identification; taxonomic status is uncertain; species may be reported falsely from Delaware; nativity of the species is uncertain; or more field work and herbaria studies are needed to better understand the current distribution and abundance of the species in the state.

SH: Historically known from the state but not verified for an extended period (usually 20 years), but there are expectations that the species may be rediscovered.

SH.1: The species is historically known in Delaware from a single location.

SX: Species has been determined or presumed to be extirpated. All historical occurrences have been searched, or all known sites have been destroyed, and a thorough search of potential habitat has been completed.

SX.1: The species was known in Delaware from a single location.

### Global Status

G1: Critically imperiled globally because of extreme rarity (5 or fewer occurrences), or because of some factor(s) making it especially vulnerable to extinction.

G2: Imperiled globally because of rarity (6-20 occurrences), or because of some other factor(s) making it very vulnerable to extinction throughout its range.

G3: Either very rare or local throughout its range (21 to 100 occurrences) or found locally (even abundantly at some of its locations) in a restricted range (e.g., a physiographic region), or because of some other factor(s) making it vulnerable to extinction throughout its range.

GH: Possibly Extinct - known from only historical occurrences but still some hope of rediscovery.

T#: The rank of a subspecies or variety. For example, T1 would apply to a variety or subspecies of a species, with a rank of G1.

### Federal Status

Endangered (LE): A species that is in danger of extinction throughout all or a significant portion of its range.

Threatened (LT): A species that is likely to become endangered sometime in the future.

### North Atlantic Region Status

R1: Critically Imperiled - at very high risk of extinction due to extreme rarity, very steep declines, or other factors.

R2: Imperiled - at high risk of extinction or elimination due to very restricted range, very few populations, steep declines, or other factors.

R3: Vulnerable - at moderate risk of extinction or elimination due to a restricted range, relatively few populations, recent and widespread declines, or other factors.

RH: Possibly Extinct - known from only historical occurrences but still some hope of rediscovery.

RX: Presumed Extinct - species not located despite intensive searches and virtually no likelihood of rediscovery.

Scientific names are arranged alphabetically. State Status, Global Status, and North Atlantic Region Status are provided in columns to the right of scientific and common names. Taxa that are Endemic or Disjunct in Delaware are labeled with an asterisk (\*) at the end of the species name. These taxa are described below. Taxa that are at the northern limit of the species natural geographic distribution, are labeled with an “N” at the end of the species name. Taxa that are at the southern limit of the species natural geographic distribution, are labeled with an “S”. Taxa that are Federally listed by the U.S. F&W Service, are labeled at the end of the species name with either “LE” (listed endangered), or “LT” (listed threatened).

*Endemic:* Endemic refers to a species that is unique to a defined geographic location, such as an island, nation, country, state or other defined zone, or habitat type. Endemic species do not occur anywhere else but within the defined geographic area.

*Disjunct:* A species or population that is widely separated geographically from other populations of the same species.
